

An interview with Lee Blanning the Bridge Group Convenor

Lee started playing bridge back in the 1990's in Bristol. He was fortunate to have a great teacher who was always on hand to give advice during Bridge sessions. Thanks to this teacher Lee's interest in Bridge was nurtured and he played for many years.

When Lee moved to South Wales in 2009 he looked around for a Bridge Group to join, but the groups he found were not particularly friendly and insisted he had a Bridge partner. As a result of this he gave up playing Bridge for about 15 years. Instead he took up raising puppy guide dogs for the blind. His goal was to raise 10 puppies. When he had achieved this it was time to look for a Bridge group again. He happened to see the u3a article in an issue of The Usk and Raglan Diary and so he went along to the Sessions House one Monday afternoon in September 2022 and joined the group. He found the group friendly and welcoming and there was no insistence on him having a partner.

In March this year, Lee took on the role Convenor. He is fitting very well into the role and enjoys it a great deal. Lee feels he has brought to the group what he learned from his encouraging teacher. Advice is always at hand if anyone wishes and hands are discussed at the end of the session. As someone who didn't have a partner to bring to the group, he makes sure it works if there is an odd number of players by stepping back and playing a hand occasionally.



Lee feels the group is going well and he is working hard to make it interesting. This year the group had an Easter event with Easter egg prizes. Another session was devoted to raising money for Age UK and Alzheimer's Research. The group also celebrated the Usk u3a anniversary in style enjoying butterfly cupcakes and prizes of wine and cheese. Future plans include a collaboration with Monmouth u3a Bridge Group, where the group will take a trip to play with members of Monmouth u3a.
