The Berlin Airlift was a response to the Soviet blockade of West Berlin from June 1948 to May 1949, where Western Allies supplied humanitarian assistance to the city by air after ground access was cut off.

It involved thousands of flights delivering food and fuel to sustain the residents of West Berlin during the crisis, demonstrating the commitment of the Western Allies to defend West Berlin against Soviet pressure. The blockade was lifted on May 12, 1949, marking a significant victory for the Allies.
